Donna Dennis: Coney Night Maze

ON VIEW: JUNE 7–SEPTEMBER 15, 2013



Thirteen years in the making, *Coney Night Maze* is a major sculptural installation by Donna Dennis, one of New York's most respected artists. This project is inspired by New York City's iconic Coney Island Cyclone, a landmark, wooden roller-coaster, whose jack-knife

turns and precipitous drops have thrilled hundreds of thousands of visitors since it opened in 1927. The monumental artwork, however, is experienced from its perimeter: "Maze encourages the viewer to circle the piece," explains Dennis. "But because there is a deserted, middle-of-the-night quality about it, it's like going into the realm of the unknown. I've created a place that people will want to get into, but they'll have to use their imagination to do that."

Donna Dennis: Coney Night Maze is organized by Helaine Posner, Senior Curator of Contemporary Art, and Avis Larson, Assistant Curator. The exhibition is accompanied by an illustrated brochure, with an essay by Jan Riley.
